Head Teacher's Comment

A cracking start!

Every year, the children here always make a positive start to their learning. But this year's start seems even brighter than usual - the best in my seven years as head teacher of Someries Junior School. The children have returned full of enthusiasm and confidence and have shown excellent attitude towards their learning and towards each other. Our new pupils in Year 3 have made a good first impression on their teachers and have been eager to learn new things. I have made regular visits to each class and have been impressed by the children's focus and effort. Long may it continue!

What's new for this year?

This term, we have welcomed new teachers (Mr Maddock in Year 6, Mrs Belizaire in Year 5) and new teaching assistants (Miss Cattermole in Year 3, Miss Pinto in Year 5). As you can see in this newsletter, we have new caterers offering improved school dinners to the children. We have also launched Spanish as our modern foreign language for all year groups. Thanks to the fundraising from our 50th anniversary celebrations last year, we have been preparing for the installation of new outdoor water fountains for the children.

This week, we received our confirmed Key Stage 2 results for 2023. It was good to see that, at 60%, the proportion of our children achieving the expected standard in all subjects (Reading, Writing and Maths) was slightly higher than the national average of 59%. The proportion of our children (13%) achieving 'greater depth' in all these subjects was also higher than the national rate (8%). You can see more details on the next page.



Someries Juniors School Key Stage 2 results 2023

Our Year 6 children worked hard to do their best in their national Key Stage 2 assessments - tests for Reading, Maths, Grammar and Spelling, along with teacher assessments in Writing. When they collected their results from Mr Hunt in July, they were very proud of their achievements and the progress they had made.

The government have now published national figures for these results and we are pleased to see that our standards for achieving the 'expected standard' in all of Reading, Writing and Maths combined, were slightly higher than the national figure.








Stakeholder feedback - Pupil Survey July 2023

In July, all the children had a chance to let Mr Hunt, the staff and the governors know how they felt about their school by completing a survey. It was good to see that the pupils feel very positive about the school. They also gave us some suggestions on how we improve the Someries Juniors experience.

The pupils were also asked:

- What makes you feel unsafe at school?
- What do you like about the school?
- What would you like to be improved at the school?

When asked what they liked about the school here are some of the positive responses:

"Everything because the teachers are so nice."

"Everybody is kind, we go on nice trips, school lunches are tasty, table prizes are fun, the teachers notice when you are good, teacher assistants help if you are stuck, it is challenging work, swimming is lots of fun, I like the lessons and I like my teachers."

"That everybody is really nice and we have really good after school clubs."

"I like this school because the pupils and teachers are funny, nice, kind and most of all respectful."

"This school also has lots of fun trips and events that happen"

"All of the teachers are really nice. They help you understand things really well."

"This is the best school I have ever been to out of the 2 other schools I have been".

"I like how the teachers are so kind, they help you whenever you're stuck and they are really good at it."

"There's music on sunny days and lots of equipment to use."

"The teachers treat you very well and are always checking to make sure that you're ok and they also like to check if there is anything they can do to help with the situation if there is something wrong."

"I also like it because I got friends and it helps me socialise with other people so I can be wayyyyyy more energetic :)"

The children also gave us feedback on what they thought could be improved and Mr Hunt and the staff will look into how to act on these ideas.
